Mayor Heitzler’s Report: ‘Red, White and Blue’



Fifty-five years ago, seven men voted to open the first duly assembled council for the Town of Goose Creek.

The seven elected white men, the so-called “redneck leaders” of that day, reported every morn-

ing to their blue collared jobs in greater Charleston.

The “red, white and blue” founders of our tiny town got to work more than a half-century ago to identify the essential goals of the newest municipality in South

Carolina. They identified: Good Schools, Safe Neighborhoods and Quality Recreation as essential elements of their preferred future. With that lucid leadership, Goose Creek emerged during the last

GCPD's Hart named Employee of the Year

What is Goose Creek PFC Justin Hart's best quality? That's a tough one.

Perhaps it is the lawman's devotion to his community – a community he not only serves, but of which he himself is an integral part.

Perhaps it is his character; in the words of Goose Creek Police Chief Harvey Becker, his "availability, thoroughness, alertness and dependability."

Perhaps it is the fact that he continually pushes himself to learn, to gain the crucial knowledge that could one day save a life – and then share that knowledge with his fellow officers.

Or perhaps it is his selfless attitude, his ability to put the needs of others ahead of his own.

No matter their ranking, all of these qualities – and many more – led Chief Becker to nominate PFC Hart as the City of Goose Creek 2016 Employee of the Year.

City Council members and Mayor Michael Heitzler agreed with the nomination, and the Mayor ended an awards presentation at the Aug. 9 Council meeting by announcing the city-wide honor.

"This is by far the greatest award I have received in any setting due to the extraordinary people that I work with," Hart said. "There are many police officers at Goose Creek that go above and beyond their normal assignments who I feel could have been selected this year.

"It is a great honor to be chosen out of

group that I highly admire."

Becker called the award a well-earned one.

"Justin is a seasoned officer who is very in-depth and detailed in his enforcement efforts," the Chief said. "It is not just one specific area that defines Justin, but every aspect of his dedication to the agency, the city, and, most importantly, the community he serves. "He's a family man first," Becker said.

Hart began his career with the GCPD in 2011. He joined the department's Strategically Assigned Officers (SAO) team in 2015. He and his wife, Tamara, have two children, Owen and Ava.

In addition to Hart, three other honors were given by the GCPD. Allison Gibson, a crime analyst, captured the department's citizen Employee of the

Year. GCPD Chaplain Jason Strong was named Volunteer of the Year. Sasha Denise Murray was presented the department's Explorer of the Year honor.

Rick Buckner, the chairman of the Goose Creek Economic Development Advisory Committee, is the city's Board/Commission Member of the Year.

The remaining 2016 Employee of the Year honorees and their respective city departments are: Court Clerk Amy Weatherford, Administration; Engineer/EMT Sean Nordaby, Fire; Head Golf Professional Bobby Donnellan, Golf; Maintenance Supervisor Michael Knight, Recreation; Groundskeeper Ezekiel "Zeke" Banks, Public Works; Snack bar attendant Patricia Turchon (Part Time/Seasonal).



Popular self-defense class returns Dec. 8

While the class does not teach citizens how to be police officers, it does give participants a deeper understanding and appreciation of the field of law enforcement.

Depending on how many residents express interest in the class,

the GCPD is planning to host a Citizen Police Academy this fall, beginning in late September, and lasting for eight consecutive weeks.

The Citizen Police Academy consists of both classroom and demonstrations with some limited physical activities for those who wish to participate.

The courses are open to Goose Creek residents ages 21 and up. Classes will be limited to 25 participants on a first-come, first-serve basis.

A background check will be conducted on all applicants.

GCPD hosts crime prevention meetings

Keeping Goose Creek crime-free is a partnership between the police and the residents of the city.

Once a quarter, the Goose Creek Police Department invites the entire community to a city-wide crime prevention meeting. Topics include crime trends and statistics within the city, new initiatives within the department that affect residents, and more.

Going out of town? GCPD's free House Watch Program available



City of Goose Creek residents are invited to visit the Goose Creek Police Department or complete an online application to request that the GCPD watch their house while they are out of town. Police

officers will make physical checks of the property on a regular, but random, basis while residents are absent.

Officers will check doors and windows for evidence of break-

ins, vandalism, or trespassing. Additionally, after the resident returns home, they will receive a letter from the police chief informing them of the number of times the house was checked.

Paperless billing option continues for water customers

Goose Creek offers water customers paperless water billing and an automatic debit option. Each month, an email will be sent from waterbill@cityofgoosecreek.com with "City of Goose Creek Utility Bill" as the subject.

Complete the form at www.cityofgoosecreek.com/DocumentCenter/View/3113 and submit it via email. As long as the authorization is received no

later than the 15th of the month before your billing date, the next bill will be emailed.

Enrolling in a monthly automatic credit/debit card payment option is another easy way for residents to pay their bill. Residents may select the payment authorization to process on the 5th or 15th of each month.

Residents will continue to receive a

monthly water bill with the amount that will be debited from a credit/debit card and it will indicate "paid by draft."

Fire Station 3 opens; HQ construction in final stage

Goose Creek's newest fire station opened earlier this year. GCFD Station 3 on Old Mount Holly Road is a one-engine station staffed at all times with four firefighters.

The City's new headquarters station is on track to open soon, possibly before the end of the 2016 calendar year.

The over-30,000 square foot headquarters is expected to be one of the best fire facilities in the Southeastern United States.

It will be located on Button Hall Avenue, and will take the place of the existing headquarters. It will include meeting space for community use.

Police, Fire and Public Service departments have to cover now versus only 10 years ago. Now consider even more square miles and a larger population in the years to come.

Among the challenges we face as City Council members is balancing the limited resources we have with the needs of our residents.

However, with every challenge comes opportunity. Goose Creek is not the same city it was in 1961 or even when I moved here in 1982. Goose Creek is a diverse, well educated, middle class community. Disposable income is as high here as it is almost anywhere in the state. Residential development alone will not cover its own cost of service; there must be proportionate commercial development. We have the opportunity to promote economic development that meets the needs of our citizens, fits into our city, and enhances our everyday life. All while preserving green space and our small town feel.

Many of us have heard the old axiom in business, “If you’re not growing, you’re dying.” The same holds true with municipalities.

If a city provides police, fire, recreation, and public services, which Goose Creek does, then it must constantly increase revenue. Inflation dictates that. Without economic development, the only place to increase revenue is property taxes. None of us want to see that.

Currently, to meet these needs, City Council and Staff are working on rebranding our city. We have a vibrant, inclusive community, and potential investors need to know what Goose Creek is today. Moreover, we live in a community worth celebrating. And, regardless of the outcome, that is a story needing to be told.


